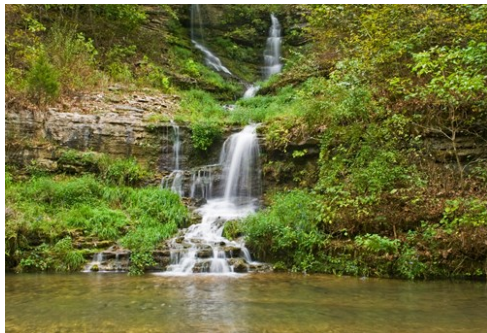

World class shows. Neon lights set aglow. Numerous attractions lining the strip. But look again—this isn't Las Vegas. This is Branson, Missouri. Lauded as the "Live Entertainment Capital of the World," Branson draws myriads of visitors to its theaters, which feature anything from comedic magic acts to Elvis Presley tributes. The natural beauty cannot be ignored either, for the Ozark Mountains provide a terrain of sparkling waters and forested trails. It does tend to be humid in Branson, but the temperatures are mild to moderate.

THE CITY

Offering premier performances without the abundance of casinos, Branson holds its own as one of America's leading entertainment destinations. Its value is substantially increased by the backdrop of the Ozark Mountains and a series of lakes and rivers.

Settled in 1882 by postmaster and store operator Reuben Branson, the township was incorporated around the construction of the Powersite Dam on the White River. The area's identity as a tourist destination began to form in 1894, when the Marble Cave was bought by entrepreneur William Henry Lynch. Visitors were charged a fee for tours of the cave; decades later it would be purchased by a couple and renamed the Marvel Cave, becoming retrofitted with electricity and staircases to become more visitor-friendly.

In 1907, the popular novel *The Shepherd of the Hills* was published by Harold Bell Wright, which reinvigorated national interest in the grandeur of the Ozarks. The 1950s and 1960s would see Branson sprout a variety of attraction mainstays, including Silver Dollar City, the Old Mill Theater, Red Foley's "Ozark Jubilee," and the Table Rock Dam. But perhaps the most pivotal moment in Branson history came in 1991, when "60 Minutes" dubbed Branson the "live music capital

of the entire universe."

Phenomenal growth in the theater, accommodation, dining, retail, real estate and service industries was spurred, bringing a profusion of tourists, business developers, performers and even new residents into Branson. Resorts and golf clubs bloomed on the lakefronts of Table Rock Lake and Lake Taneycomo, while Branson Landing became a hub of dining and shopping attractions along its strip.

Branson Scenic Railway



As the pathway through the Ozark Mountains, the Branson Scenic Railway offers a 40-mile roundtrip journey through spectacular tunnels and breathtaking foothills. Panoramic views of the Ozarks are seen through each of the dome cars

and wide windows, and seating is unassigned. Passengers learn the history of the area as concessions are offered on the Silver Lake car, and a luxurious dinner train runs May through December on Saturdays. As seating is limited on the dinner train, reservations are required.

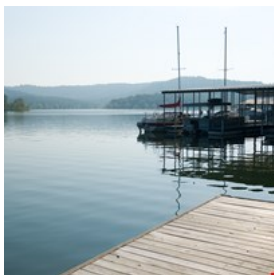

Nestled amidst the Ozark Mountains is Table Rock Lake, a Mecca for aquatic enthusiasts and fishermen. Swimming, wake-boarding, skiing, tubing, racing, and diving can all be done in the lake, while hikers will find the endless trails and wildlife alluring. Underneath Table Rock is the massive Missouri cave system—which is also open for exploration. Fishermen will be interested to know the record largemouth bass, catfish, crappie, and other fish reside at the lake. And all of Branson's attractions lie just beyond the hills.

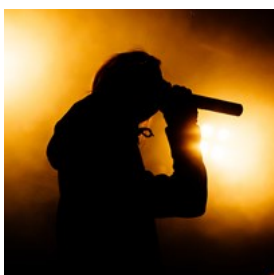
