The city is perfect for walking with no slopes, plenty of cafés and lots to look at. 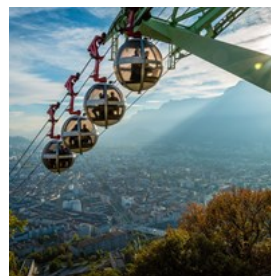

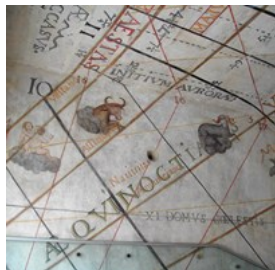
Palais Ideal

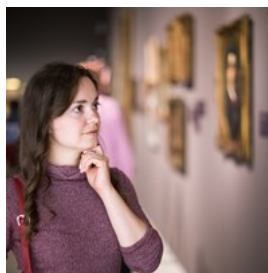
Horloge Solaire

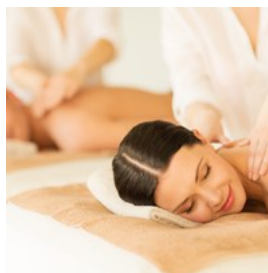

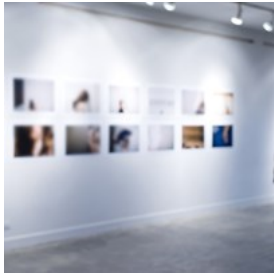
Chateau De La Commanderie - Spa

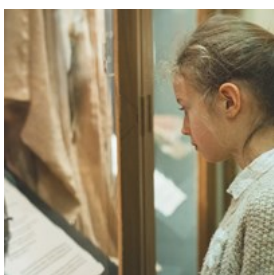

time.

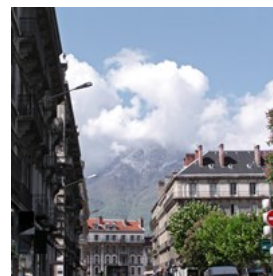
