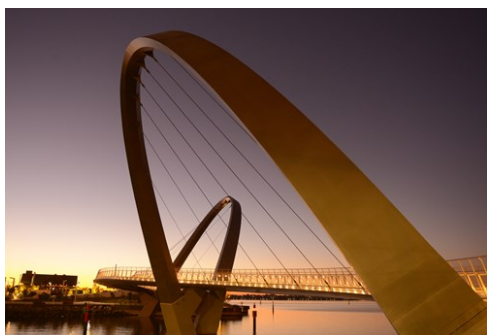

THE CITY

The Central Business District of Perth straddles the banks of the Swan River, its skyscrapers shimmering in the glare of the sun. This is the commercial and economic heart of the city with endless shopping opportunities and also home to some of its major cultural attractions like the Bell Tower, Perth Mint, His Majesty's Theatre and also the majestic Kings Park, an oasis of serenity after a hard day's sightseeing.

Northbridge, which is located just outside the central district, is Perth's entertainment and cultural mecca. Here you will find an array of cafés, restaurants, bars and nightclubs, while also offering a number of museums and galleries.

Decidedly lower-key than Northbridge, Subiaco is however a thriving cosmopolitan district that has numerous cafés, restaurants, boutiques, theatres and is also home to the Subiaco Oval the birthplace of Australian Rules football.

If you're looking to head for the shores of the Indian Ocean then the white sands of Cottesloe beach is only a stone's throw away and is easily accessible by bus. Or why not take a cruise down the Swan River to the historic and lively suburb of Fremantle?

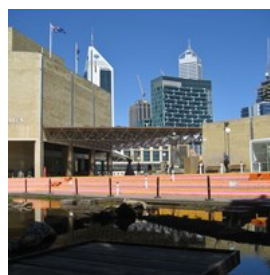

Passport/Visa



Unless you are a New Zealand citizen granted visa exemption on arrival (in most cases), you will need to obtain a visa prior to visiting Australia.

Citizens of all European Union countries, as well as Andorra, Norway, Iceland, San Marino, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Monaco, and Vatican City are eligible for an eVisitor visa, which can be applied for online. For citizens of the United States, Canada, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Brunei, South Korea and Malaysia, the Electronic

Travel Authority (ETA) entry permit is available, which can be applied for online and grants holders the right to enter Australia an unlimited amount of times for stays of no longer than 3 months per visit.

Citizens of all other world countries (with the exception of Somalia) are also able to apply for a visitor visa online.
