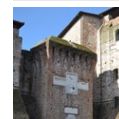

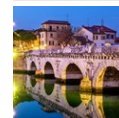

THE CITY

Rimini belongs to the Emilia-Romagna region of Italy and is the capital city of the Province of Rimini. It is located between the rivers Marecchia and Ausa and is a city of contrasts. In the center, for instance, ancient narrow streets and cosmopolitan squares, such as Piazza Cavour, Piazza Tre Martiri and Corso d'Augusto stand in contrast to the tourist zones and beach areas where lively bars and restaurants attract families and couples alike.

Rimini is divided into districts, each with its own unique character: Bellariva, Marebello, Marina Centro, Miramare, Rivabella, Rivazzurra, San Giuliano Mare, Torre Pedrera and Viserba. The 'must+see' attractions include the beautiful Tiberius Bridge, which dates from the 1st Century AD, the Pigna Fountain and the Great Arch of Augustus.

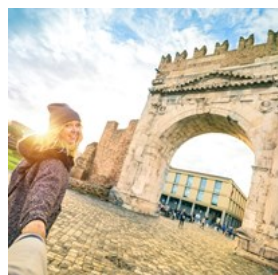

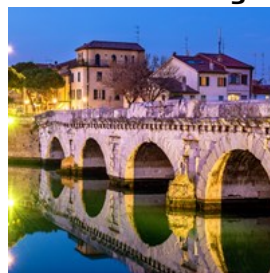

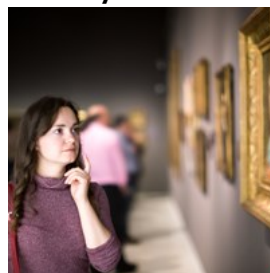
Tempio Malatestiano

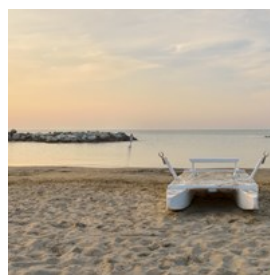
The City Musuem

Rimini is a city where the night is always young. The locals follow a precise nighttime routine: as soon as the sun sets they start out at Rimini's seaside bars and then head to the clubs and discos, where they spend the period between midnight and the wee hours of the morning. Among the numerous festivals that Rimini offers, the most special one is "La Notte Rosa", which is the greatest festival of the summer, the so called summer New Year in the riviera. Passport / Visa



Italy can be visited visa-free for up to 90 days by citizens from Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, Malaysia, Israel,

UAE and most countries in America. If you are not sure whether or not you need to apply for a visa, we recommend you to contact the embassy or consulate in your country. In order to enter the Schengen zone, international (non-Schengen) travellers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip. The climate is warm in spring and early autumn, and very hot during the summer months (June-August), which makes it perfect for a beach vacation.
