Waterville Valley was incorporated as a New Hampshire town in 1829. This naturally was well before the town became a veritable, year-round resort destination. Its position in the White Mountain National Forest attracted the attention of the accommodation industry, which possessed the foresight to realize the opportunity in Waterville Valley's slopes, hills, mountains and lakes.


